

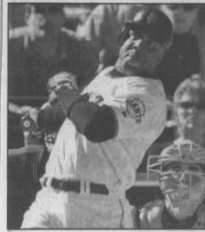

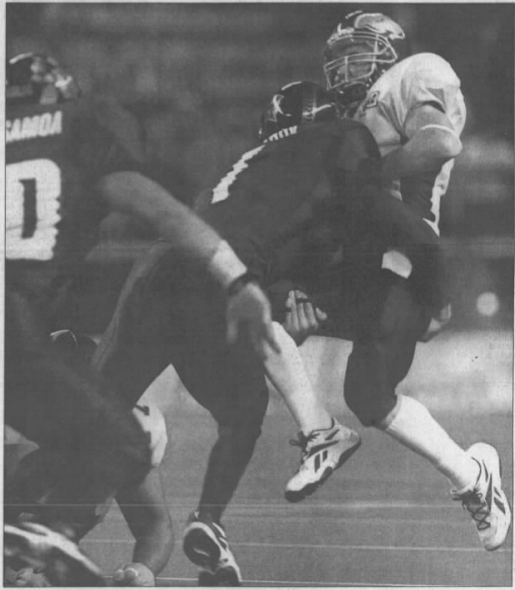

The night started with a reading of the "Pledge of Allegiance" and ended for the University of Hawaii's football team, with the realization that there isn't always justice for all. UH's gritty defensive effort was obscured by Rice's frenetic 27-24 victory at Aloha Stadium. Brandon Sledge, who earlier missed three field goals, kicked the winning field goal from 38 yards with 2:36 to play, completing the Chiefs' surge from a 50-point deficit. A crowd of 32,948 watched the Warriors lose their second in a row

to fall to 1-2 overall and 0-2 in the Western Athletic Conference. "It's too frustrating for words," UH middle linebacker Chris Brown said. "We gave it everything we had and... it's so frustrating. That's all I can say." Now, the Warriors will hold their collective breath as they await health reports on quarterback Tim Chang, who suffered a sprain on his right throwing wrist, and safety Nate Jackson, who did not play after the first quarter because of a concussion.
