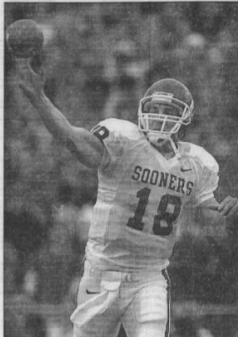

Quarterback Tim Chang, who led the seventh player in NCAA history to amass 12,000 career passing yards.

Chang reached the milestone with an 87-yard pass on the last play of the first quarter.

He finished with 25 of 43 for 267 yards and two touchdowns. He also scored on a 2-yard touchdown.

"I feel really comfortable at home," said Chang, a fourth-year junior from Saint Louis School.

"I love playing in this stadium. I stayed home for a reason. I wouldn't want to play in any other place."

Starback Chad Owens, who pulled in a school-record 14 receptions. He had 106 receiving yards and a touchdown.
